



It is the beginning of summer and we have already had so many events! From the Croton Fest booth to the Lorraine Hansberry event in the community to voting to become a Reconciling in Christ congregation! It has been a full summer already.


The summer is a time to relax a little, take a vacation, and get a little reading in. Every year I pick a theologian and read all of her/his/their works. This year, my focus is on Indigenous theology and the Christian church. In short, there are two general camps with lots of grey in between. The one camp states that Christianity and the Indigenous communities cannot combine due to the long history of persecution by the church toward the Indigenous people. The second camp states that the two can come together, but there would be a need for deep recognition of harm, including repentance and reparation while allowing the Native voice to shape the new Christian church. That is my focus.

The ELCA has suggested congregations read a book by an Indigenous author throughout the summer. For me, it is like saying, pick your favorite book as there are too many to choose from. I am going to suggest the congregation pick one of two books. One is a great introduction to Indigenous writing and is a "safer" entry into the writing. What I mean by that is due to the trauma of the people, much Indigenous writing contains sexual assault, violence, and unlearned history. This book doesn't dive into that. It was a NY Times bestseller title "Braiding Sweetgrass" by Robin Kimmerer. In the book, she discusses the relationship between humankind and plants, the healing properties of nature, and care for the Earth.

The second book is for those who want to be challenged a little bit. It is "An Indigenous People's History of the United States" by Roxanne Dunbar-Ortiz. Dunbar-Ortiz tells the history of the United States from the perspective of those who were living here already. The book discusses the harm of the Doctrine of Discovery, the laws that led to the death of millions of Indigenous people, the Trail of Tears, and other such items of history, but rather than tell them from the European perspective, which we often hear, it is told from documents from Indigenous people.

I hope this summer, you might pick up one of these books and see what you think about a different perspective. Happy summer!
